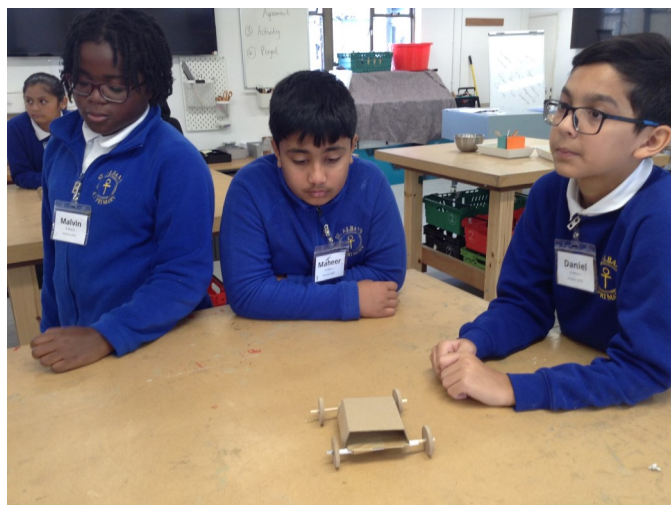
SCHOOL NEWSLETTER 19.09.25

Article 12 – respect for the views of the child
